




# SSS League Championship

# *Sh. Khaled bin Hamad Basketball Championship (Secondary School)*

ARKIS FLAMES is full of outstanding student-athletes who love challenges and new experiences, regardless of their difficulty. We received a kind invitation from the Ministry of Education to participate in the Sheikh Khalid bin Hamad Basketball Tournament for secondary schools. It was an excellent and unique opportunity for our students, and the goal was to reach as far as possible.

The students were informed and trained for the first qualifying match of the main round (group stage), and we successfully advanced. We were placed in a strong group, and our team qualified for the group stage, beginning with a victory over Sheikh Abdulaziz Government School, 76-68, after a great match from both sides. While our team lacked a little concentration at times, they rose to the occasion and achieved our goal—winning the match.



In what was considered the strongest match in the group, our team played against Al-Muharraq Government School. It was an exciting match, with Al-Muharraq dominating and winning 73-56 over our school. However, we were missing some players due to injury. With one match left against Sacred Heart, a win will qualify us for the next round.



# *Bahrain Marathon Relay Race (BBK)*

Among the tournaments that are loved by everyone and eagerly anticipated is the Bahrain Marathon. The school participated with one team consisting of 10 students, each of whom ran a distance of 3 kilometers.

The Physical Education Department would like to thank the officials, led by Ms. Kate, for their continued support of school sports and for providing our students and the Physical Education Department with many opportunities to participate and raise the school's profile. We would also like to thank Mr. Hussein Mirza, Mr. Nasser, and Mr. Sayed from the Security Department for their support and contribution to this race.

Returning to the events of the race, an agreement was reached with the participating students, who gave double the effort through training both inside and outside the school, showing commitment, seriousness, and sacrifice to achieve the goal of completing the 3 km with a specific pace and target. The race was held on Friday, November 21, 2025, at the Bahrain International Circuit. The champions arrived on time and were assigned to their designated starting points. They gave their all and finished fourth out of 26 schools and universities, and 21st out of 166 teams! This is considered a remarkable achievement after a hiatus and a relatively short training period. In the coming years, the ARKIS Running Team will be even stronger and fiercer, so let's stay ready!
